



Apple Approach for the Classroom

- Read Books about apples
- Apple Through the Senses (use the senses to describe an apple)
- Describe apples (circle/bubble map used for brainstorming)
- Nutritional qualities/ health benefits of an apple, fiber, what group it's a part of on pyramid etc.(why they are good for you)
- Learn where apples came from, time line of apple history, research legends like Johnny AppleSeed, and then create your own apple tale
- Map apple orchards in your area
- Figure out how far apples travel to get to your store
- Taste and Learn about different kinds of apples (taste test). Chart the favorite kinds in your classroom
- Create a maze on paper to get a kid to the apple at the end
- Create an Apple Recipe book, with recipes that contain apples in them
- Understand the parts of an apple (dissect an apple to find out)
- Apple Art (create a shirt/ bag by cutting an apple in half, dipping it in paint and then making prints on that shirt)
- Create an APPLE-ing Play
- Make an apple creature with an apple and other food pieces like marshmallows, raisins etc.
- Explain how apples grow, or create a flow chart of the process of apple to cider, or apple turned into a pie
- What has apple in it? (try to come up with a list of products that have apple in some form in it)
- Apples overtime- see what happens to an apple, if you let it sit in your room over a period of time, make observations daily, weekly
- Create a survey on favorite apple types in your room
- Apple tree in Seasons (compare apple trees and what they are doing, during each season, also draw these)
- Promote apples through slogans, posters
- Apple Fractions (cutting apples into halves, thirds, etc.)
- Figure out what apples cost and have kids answer story problems about apples, or create a pie graph comparing apple prices
 - If apples cost 3.00 per lb, and you wanted to purchase 3 lbs, how much would your apples cost?
- Find songs, quotes etc that have apple in them, and explain what they mean
 - An apple a day keeps the doctor away
 - You are the apple of my eye
- Have an Apple fair, and have kids share what they learned about apples, in different projects and presentations
