Subject: Applications for Watershed Development and Planning Assistance Grants reminder

Action needed: Applications are due by **Friday, July 10, 2009** for consideration

The Division of Soil Conservation is accepting applications for Watershed Development and Planning Assistance Grants. Applications are accepted continuously with grants issued quarterly. The next cutoff date to review applications received this quarter is **Friday, July 10, 2009**. The purpose of this program is to assist soil and water conservation districts develop effective watershed project proposals designed to protect soil, water quality, and other natural resources, and improve flood control.

This program allows districts and your partners to complete a comprehensive watershed assessment, identify natural resource problem(s) and their potential source(s), prepare a watershed plan to address the identified problem(s), identify local partners, and determine landowner support for implementing the watershed plan. Sufficient information should be generated so that a concise application can be made to various grant programs including the Watershed Protection Fund (WSPF), Water Protection Fund (WPF), EPA 319 through the Iowa DNR, and the Watershed Improvement Fund administered by the Watershed Improvement Review Board (WIRB).

The funds offered via Watershed Development and Planning Assistance Grants are not intended to implement best management practices (BMPs). Rather, the funds are intended to defray expenses of completing the assessment, planning, and information and education processes. Acceptable costs could include, but are not limited to:

- additional staff to gather data as part of a GIS-based watershed assessment and to develop a watershed project plan and application
- materials to conduct information and education activities
- postage and printing costs to conduct a stakeholder survey

New to this Request For Applications is a Water Monitoring Supplement Grant Application. The Water Monitoring Supplement Grant Application is being offered through the DNR Watershed Improvement Section for requesting EPA 319 program funds. If your SWCD determines that additional funding from the DNR is needed for detailed water quality monitoring for the watershed being assessed, then this form needs to be prepared and submitted along with the Watershed Development and Planning Assistance Grant application. This supplemental application is not required if additional detailed water quality monitoring is not requested.

Application Guidance:

- Districts are encouraged to request the assistance of your appropriate Regional Coordinator in developing their application. The Regional Coordinators are listed below:

- To be considered for funding under this quarter's grants, applications are to be received by **Friday, July 10, 2009**.
- An application template is attached to this memo and should be used to submit your application.
- There should be sufficient data in a well-written three to five page template document for reviewers to make an informed decision. Maps and other supportive data relevant to your proposed project can be attached and will not count towards the three to five pages.
- Applicants will be notified after evaluations are complete as to which applications were tentatively selected subject to an acceptable plan of work and budget being approved.

Please note that districts submitting applications by the deadline should not plan to begin watershed development and assessment activities for 90 days or more, as a plan of work and budget will need to be developed and submitted by the applicant for approval by the Division.

I encourage your district to evaluate watershed protection needs in your county, and consider applying for a Watershed Development and Planning Assistance Grant.
